

English Punctuation & Grammar: Easy Practice Paper 2 Answers

Q#	Answer	Explanation
1	C	'the first saturday' names a day of the week, and the days of the week are proper nouns, so saturday must begin with a capital letter: the first Saturday. The month June already has its capital. The mistake is in group C.
2	E	Every mark in this line is correct. The comma before and is right, because it is joining two complete sentences into one, and the full stop closes the line. So there is no mistake in this line.
3	A	'Mrs Khans class' means the class belonging to Mrs Khan, so this is a possessive and needs an apostrophe before the s: Mrs Khan's class. The mistake is in group A.
4	D	'this morning' is the end of the sentence, but there is nothing to close it. A statement finishes with a full stop: this morning. The mistake is in group D.
5	B	'that they wont' is missing an apostrophe. Wont is the short form of will not, and an apostrophe stands in place of the letters that have been left out: won't. The mistake is in group B.
6	D	'a teacher.' closes the line with a full stop, but the sentence begins Have you ever, so it is a question and must end with a question mark: a teacher? The mistake is in group D.
7	E	Every mark in this line is correct. It is one short sentence with no list and no extra description inside it, so it needs no commas, and it ends with a full stop. So there is no mistake in this line.
8	C	'head teacher were' does not agree. A head teacher is one person, so the verb must be was: our head teacher was soaked. The mistake is in group C.

9	B	'my sister and me' is doing the running, so it is the subject of the sentence and takes I, not me: my sister and I. Take my sister out and you would say I am going to run, never me am going to run. The mistake is in group B.
10	A	'we hope' begins a new sentence, because the line before it ended with a full stop, so its first word needs a capital letter: We hope. The mistake is in group A.
